## Invitation to bid Reopening Treasury discount paper of the Federal Republic of Germany (Unverzinsliche Schatzanweisungen – "Bubills")

For the account of the Federal Government, the German Finance Agency, through Deutsche Bundesbank, will reopen once again the

Treasury discount paper of the Federal Republic of Germany (Unverzinsliche Schatzanweisungen – "Bubills") January 2023 issue / maturity 11 months due on 13 December 2023, residual maturity 6 months (182 interest days) ISIN DE000BU0E006

launched on 30 January 2023, using an auction procedure. An increase of  $\in$  3 billion is envisaged for the issue (auction allotment and retention quote). The current volume amounts to  $\in$  6 billion.

Members of the Bund Issues Auction Group are entitled to bid. Bids must be for a par value of not less than € 1 million or an integral multiple thereof. The price bids must be expressed as full 0.00005 percentage points. It is possible to submit non-competitive bids and several bids at different prices. No yield bids will be considered. The bids accepted by the issuer will be allotted at the price specified in the bid. Non-competitive bids are filled at the weighted average price of the price bids accepted. The right to scale down bids is reserved.
